#### TENURE AND DESCRIPTIVE PARTICULARS.

All That and Those part of the Lands of Ballyturin containing 40a. 3r. 27p. or thereabouts, statute measure, with the Mansion House and Out-offices thereon, known as Ballyturin House, situate in the Barony of Kiltartan and County of Galway, held in fee simple, together with a Right of Turbarry on other part of said lands of Ballyturin containing 2a. 3r. 38p.

The Land Commission will make an advance of £572 for the purchase of the Fee Simple of the property pursuant to the provisions of the Land Purchase Acts, repayable by an annuity of £27 3s. 6d., which will be subject to such revision (if any) as the Purchaser is entitled to under the Land Acts, 1903-06. The lands will be sold subject to such advance and the Annuity payable in respect thereof.

Ballyturin House is situated about four miles East of Gort, the nearest town and Railway Station, overlooking Lough Cufra and some 26 miles from Galway. It is a two-storey building of the basement type containing Hall, three Reception Rooms, four Bedrooms (one with dressing room attached), two Kitchens, Dairy, Scullery, Pantry, and two servants' Bedrooms. The Out-offices include in Yard adjoining the House a two-storey masonry building, wooden turf shed, open Hay Shed on wooden supports, with Galvanised Roof.
